Gainsborough Keeps

This term our Gainsborough keep focus is on Keep green.

We will be Planting seeds and bulbs and observing growth and decay over time. We will continue to learn what plants need to grow and will explore ways to care for them.



Literacy

This term we will be reading the following stories in class:

- The Very Busy Spider
- Jasper's Beanstalk



Phonics

We will be starting our Read Write inc phonics lessons this term focusing on the set I sounds. Children will be learning two sounds per week and have opportunities to recap in the provision. We will also continue to support children's phonological awareness by clapping out syllables in words and develop their awareness of rhythm and rhymes in speech.





Reading

Children in nursery love reading and we therefore strongly encourage you to read with your child on a regular basis and provoke as many discussions around the text or their areas of interest.

You can do this by:

- Talk about illustration, characters, and key events.
- DEAR: Drop Everything And Read!
- Focusing on your child's interest and do not have to finish the entire book in one go if your child would like to spend more time talking about what they can see in the book.
- Use 'what', 'why', 'who', 'where' and 'how'
 questions when you are
 prompting your child!

<u>Maths</u>

For this coming half term we will be focusing on:

- Say one number for each item in order; 1, 2, 3, 4, 5. (One to one correspondence)
- Begin to show 'finger numbers' up to 5, and link numerals to amounts up to 5.
- Continue to count objects in a line and learn that the last number reached when counting a small set of objects tells you how many there are in total (cardinal principle)
- Begin to understand positional language through words alone (e.g. in, on, under, up, down)



<u>Topic</u>

Our topic this half term is: 'minibeasts, plants and growing'. We will explore a range of minibeasts including their names, characteristics, and make comparisons with vertebrates and invertebrates within the environment. We will continue to explore different life cycles and observe closely in how plants and minibeasts grow, change and decay. By making connections to our previous core text 'The Crunching Munching cater-

pillar, we will continue to explore and build our understanding on how living things arous

living things grow and their life cycles.
