Maths


For this coming half term we will be focusing on:

- Number: Have a deep understanding of numbers up to 10, including the composition of each number.
- Numerical patterns: Compare quantities up to 10 in different contexts.
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- Number: Subitise up to 5
- Number: Have a deep understanding of numbers up to 10. Automatically recall number bonds up to 5 (including subtraction facts) and some number bonds to 10, including double facts.

We will have mark making opportunities in different areas of the provision.We will be writing character descriptions, making lists, instructions and retelling story on a story mapWe will be using our phonic knowledge to write the sounds we can hear in words.Children will begin to use finger spaces and full stops in their sentences.

Topic

Winter/My Community and Transport/Lunar New Year

This half term we will be learning about Winter, Animals and Lunar New Year.Children will learn about different seasons and think about the similarities and differences in each season. They will learn and find out about the changes that take place during Winter.Children will learn about different animals and their young. They will also learn about the habitats of these animals. In the last week of term, they will explore how and why some people celebrate Lunar New year

Homework

We will be giving out reading books for children and family to read at home. This includes a reading for pleasure book and a book linked to your child's phonics level, that supports children's writing and communication skills. Homework will be given out every Friday and should be returned on the following Wednesday.
