There are 7 areas of the EYFS curriculum which we cover in our indoor and outdoor provision. These areas are:

Prime Areas

- · Personal, Social and Emotional

Development

· Physical Development

Specific Areas

- · Literacy (writing/reading)

- · Understanding the World
- · Expressive Arts and Design

Maths

In Nursery, children will build on previous learning by comparing objects according to their properties and quantities. They will explore and talk about patterns in the environment. They will use natural resources to create their own patterns. They will also begin to categorise and sort different objects according to their properties and will continue to select a small number of objects from a group.

Literacy

Our core texts for this term are:

- · The leaf man
- · The everywhere bear
- · Dear Santa



Throughout this half term we will build awareness of sounds in our surrounding environment. We will ask questions and share ideas about a book, including character description and drawing characters from the text. Children will begin to notice repeated refrains in stories and will retell stories using story maps and

props. We will engage in discussion and make connections to our personal experiences, by expressing our ideas or mark make via a variety of tools.

Topic

Autumn/people and places/Christmas

In the first three weeks, we will be exploring the Autumn season and discussing the changes in weather, plants and Autumnal animals. We will be experimenting with various sensory Autumn objects and natural resources such as pumpkins, conkers, leaves, and pinecones. In the next three weeks, children will share their own experiences of something they care about and discuss how and why they have to look after something special to them. They will build on their previous learning in Autumn 1 about taking up responsibility for looking after our family, friends, and pets. In the last week, children will develop an understanding of the celebration of Christmas. We will discuss what it represents and how it is celebrated in different families, in different ways.

Reading Book packs

We will be giving out reading book packs to children and family to read at home. This includes activities relevant to the story that supports children's writing and communication skills. Each book pack will be given out **every Friday** and should be returned on the following **Tuesday**.

Forest School

Our first forest school session of this half term will start from week 1, 5th November and will run every Tuesday from **8:45-11:30 and 1:15-3:15pm** This will be a great opportunity for your child's learning and holistic development. Children will need labelled wellies and weather appropriate clothing.

Family Fridays

We would like to welcome you into our class to do an activity with your child from 9.00-9.30am **every other Friday**.
