Reading for Pleasure!

We have been looking at how we can enjoy reading, why we should read outside of lessons and what books we would like more of in our classes.

These are the books we have read this year so far, can you talk to your child about these books?



Maths

For this coming half term we will be focusing on:

- Match numeral and quantity to 5
- Know that a group of things change in quantity when something is added or taken away.
- Talk about and explore 2D and 3D shapes using mathematical language.
- Make comparisons between objects relating to weight.
- Extend, continue and create ABAB patterns.
- Notice and correct an error in a repeating pattern.

Literacy

Our core texts for this term are: 'What the ladybird heard,' and 'The very hungry caterpillar.'



Throughout this half term we will be exploring the season of Spring and making comparisons to Winter, noting what is the same and what is different. The key vocabulary that we are going to be learning are: spring, flowers, seasonal changes, farming, farm animal names, cocoon, caterpillar, ladybird. When reading What the

ladybird heard, we will explore different farm animals and the sounds that we can hear on a farm. We will also explore the use of maps, what a map is and how it can help us get from place to place easily - we will draw our maps in the nursery.

When we are reading The very hungry caterpillar we will be looking at changes in animals during the springtime, looking at baby animals and adult animals with a focus on the process of how caterpillars turn into butterflies. We will discuss the lifecycle of a caterpillar, how long it takes for a caterpillar to turn into a butterfly and what happens after it is a butterfly. We will use our new vocabulary in our talk and play.

Topic Spring/Farmyard animals/World Book day/ Easter

In the first three weeks we will explore different farm animals and learn about what a working farm is and what we can produce on a working farm. We will talk about milking cows, shearing sheep as well as the vehicles that we see on farms such as combine harvesters and tractors. We will use this new vocabulary in our talk and play. We will also be celebrating World Book Day in week 2 of this term where children can come dressed as their favourite book character and explore games and activities based on our favourite books.

In the last three weeks of this term we will focus on Springtime and the changes that take place in this season. We will look at the animals that will be born, the changes to the leaves, trees and the flowers that will begin to grow at this time of year also. Toward the end of the term we will focus on Easter and talk about what Easter represents for some people and how different people across the world celebrate with their own traditions.

Reading Book packs

We will be giving out reading book packs to children and family to read at home. This includes activities relevant to the story that supports children's writing and communication skills. Each book pack will be given out **every Friday** and should be returned on the following **Tuesday**.

Forest School

Our first forest school session of this half term will start from week 1, 27th February and will run every Thursday from **8:45-11:30 am**. This will be a great opportunity for your child's learning and holistic development. If you can join as a volunteer please speak to a member of staff. Children will need labelled wellies and weather appropriate clothing.
